Ashes shaped into a cross remind us of the hope we have in Christ Jesus. That's our mission at Gloria Dei to reflect the hope of God through celebration, connection, and compassion. Perhaps one way each of us could be about hope in the face of ashes is to <u>invite</u> someone to a Lenten worship service or event.

Ashes to the empty tomb - Sometimes we speak of our Lent as a journey - Jesus walking with us, so that we can walk each other home.

Soup: It's What's For Dinner (Wednesday Nights During Lent)

One of my favorite traditions here at Gloria Dei – and there are lots! – has to be the Wednesday night Lent soup suppers. Needless to say, one of the reasons I love the soup suppers is because of the soup. Soup is one of my favorite meals. And most Wednesday nights, I cannot choose just one, but end up sampling several of the delicious varieties created by talented congregation members.

What I also find interesting and beautiful about the Lenten soup supper is the fact that people always end up sitting next to or across from people that they don't know

- either they go to different services or they simply haven't crossed paths yet - and then wonderful conversation begins, and sometimes even new friendships. This year, the confirmation students and their mentors were encouraged to eat together during the first soup supper on Ash Wednesday, and I know that some great connections were made.

This tradition isn't just about good food. There is a theological reason why we gather together for soup suppers during Lent (or gather for meals at any time, really). We know that Jesus ate with his followers and with outsiders and even large crowds of strangers sometimes. He ate with people and then taught. He ate with people and then healed. And we know he ate with his disciples and then went to the cross. This simple act of fellowship was one way in which Jesus relates to us. There is a bond that occurs when we share a table together.

Acts 2:46 reminds us that after Jesus died, the followers of Christ created community in the following way: "And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts."

So I hope you will join us in breaking bread, ladling soup, passing water cups, and sharing in conversation before our Wednesday evening service during this season of Lent!

LOS ANGELITOS ORPHANAGE MINISTRY

My name is Rosa Ramirez. I came to Los Angelitos Orphanage as a child. I am originally from Chiapas, the poorest part of Mexico, where few opportunities exist for someone born into poverty.

At the age of 14, I realized there was no way out of the severe poverty of my hometown. I dreamed to seek a better quality of life so I set out for the long journey to the big city of Tijuana. After arriving in Tijuana I began working in a factory for 12 hours a day, six days a week for very little pay. Still only 14 years old, I was confused, alone, sad, and didn't know what would become of my life.

Then things went wrong. Bad things happened to me and because I was a minor, I ended up under the jurisdiction of the court system and placed in a large government building for abandoned children. But after several months in the

holding facility, an incredible miracle happened; a room became available for me with my newborn child and we were warmly accepted with open arms into the home of Los Angelitos Orphanage.

I knew that this home was one of the greatest things that could happen to me. I finally had a loving family and a secure home that provided me with an opportunity to get an education, start a career, and, one day, to help others in need. Los Angelitos has given me strength and determination to move forward in my life without looking back at all the hardships and things that happened to me.

I am now a nurse having graduated from the University of UNIDEP. I am so thankful to give back to others as I have been so blessed.

I would like to thank all of you that have contributed so generously to make my dreams come true. Thank all of you for supporting the home of Los Angelitos Orphanage.
