Dear Gloria Dei family,

I'm guessing - at the time of this writing (May 1), nothing has changed, but Bishop Taylor has begun to give direction to what **"opening up"** for worship and other groups might mean. The operative word is **"gradual."** Here are very tentative ideas:

- We continue to practice recommended guidelines - washing hands, standing at least 6 feet apart, wearing masks, and staying home if you're at risk.
- Fewer people at each service. We continue to livestream services, we rope off rows, and open up the doors for people to sit outside. We have baptisms, First Communions, confirmations, baccalaureates to celebrate and we may limit the gatherings to those people initially. People can sit in their cars to watch if they would like, maybe even tune in to our own FM station or use their own smart device.
- No handshaking, nothing passed around or in pews (bulletins, offering plates, hymnals, Bibles), everything on the screen. The ushers will keep people moving forward to enter or exit.
- No fellowship/coffee time between services, at least initially. This one kills me!
- All the outside groups invited back if they can follow the guidelines above re. distancing, etc.
- Our Preschool will open in August following all guidelines for children.
- Bible studies, youth meetings, Vacation Bible School, fellowship events, service trips, youth trips - all of these things will be opened up gradually or postponed for safety.

It will be different, but great! We can look each other in the eye, be close through the proclamation of the Gospel of the Savior's love and worship of the One who *"holds all things together."* (Colossians 1:17)

Summer (or quarantine) reading list

Around this time, I usually fill my article with books that I recommend for summer reading. I've been reading a lot more during this quarantine time - not at the beach, unfortunately, but at home, in bed, while the kids are playing, and occasionally at the office. If you are looking for good reading material for the next few months - here is my list for Summer 2020:

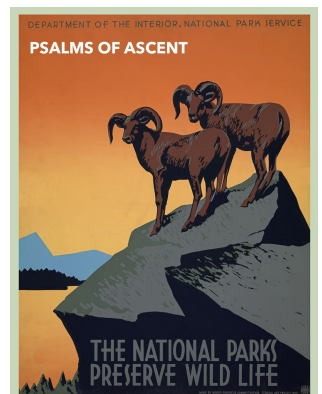
1. ***Braving the Wilderness: The Quest for True Belonging and the Courage to Stand Alone* by Brene Brown** - Brene Brown has done some really amazing research and talks on vulnerability. This book is a little bit about community and a lot about humanity. It is about shared experiences and loneliness at the same time. And it is extremely, extremely relatable.
2. ***A Pilgrimage to Eternity: From Canterbury to Rome in Search of a Faith* by Timothy Egan** - This one is for all the history buffs out there. But it's not at all dry or textbook-y. It is a very concise (as concise as covering such a broad and far-reaching topic can be) look at historical sites of religious significance. And some of the book is downright funny.
3. ***Convictions: How I Learned What Matters Most* by Marcus Borg** - Marcus Borg is an amazing Christian author and man of faith. This book is one of my favorites of his because it is all about hope. It was published just before he died and contains many important insights about how to live a life centered around what matters most. I reread this book recently and found many more thoughts that continue to shape my perspective.
4. ***Becoming Mrs. Lewis: The Improbable Love Story of Joy Davidman and C. S. Lewis* by Patti Callahan** - I love reading through C.S. Lewis, from his more fantasy and sci fi novels to his very deeply spiritual books. This particular book chronicles the true story of the relationship between C.S. Lewis and Joy Davidman, which began as a friendship and then ended in a short marriage, preempted by Joy's death. It's a beautiful story mostly from the perspective of Joy, but also interlaced with glimpses of C.S. Lewis' life and faith.

THE BIG THING

(The focus, the main thing, put it on your calendar, a second/third/fourth reminder)

PSALMS OF ASCENT (Psalms, 120–134): Our Summer emphasis will be on a group of Psalms which emphasize going up, journeying to Zion, etc. They are also called Gradual Psalms, Songs of Degrees, Songs of Steps or Pilgrim Songs. Each one will be connected to one of the nine National Parks in California. There will also be Passports and stickers each week. Passports/stickers will be given out during the Children's Messages, but adults might want one for note taking and more. This is a wonderful Gen2Gen activity. There will also be a summer Bible study based on each Psalm for the coming Sunday. Watch the bulletin for more details.

FINANCES AND PLANNING: The Council is planning for various scenarios for our parish, preschool, staffing, ministries, etc. Thanks to the many people who are continuing to support the ministry of Gloria Dei through your contributions. 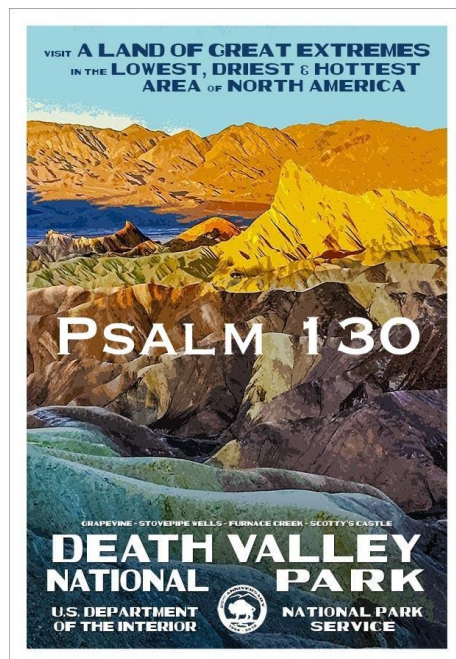
FIRST COMMUNION will take place as soon as in-person worship services resume. Congratulations to those four students who will receive their First Communion on this special day!

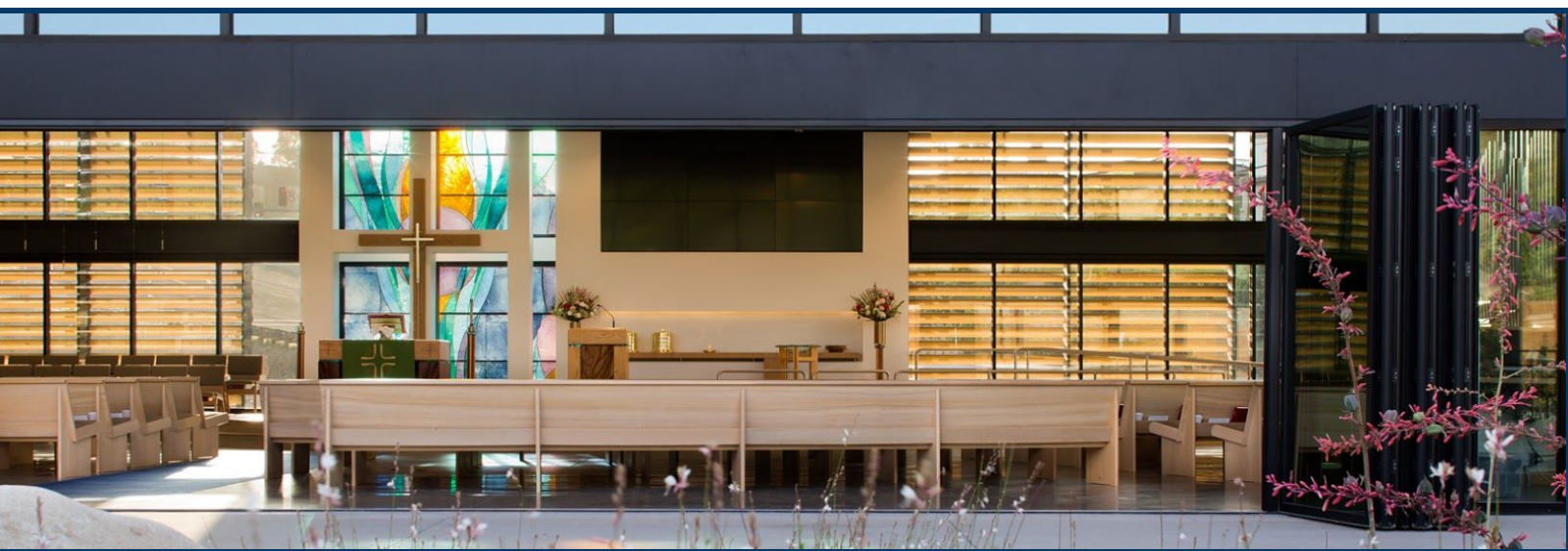

(All things related to service, ministry, helping others, compassion, caring, loving, serving "the least of these", etc.)

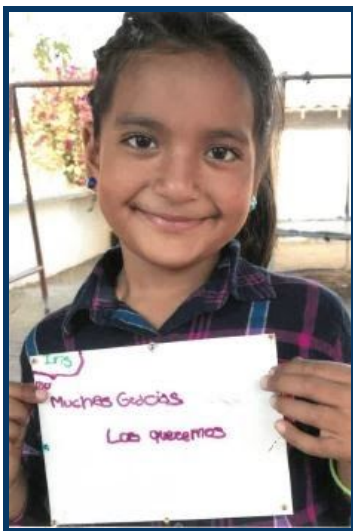
