WELCOME to worship! We continue our summer emphasis: "The Inside Outside Church." That is, we come together inside to be inspired and to give thanks, but then we go outside to be the church in service to all. A part of this theme will be a different classic prayer connected to scripture. We also will sing parts of a new musical liturgy/chanting. You will learn it quickly! THE INSIDE OUT CHURCH: The Prayer for the Week by Thomas Merton

My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following Your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please You does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that, if I do this, You will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore I will trust You always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for You are ever with me, and You will never leave me to face my perils alone. Amen.
