PRAYER OF THE DAY

THE FIRST LESSON: Exodus 20:1-11

Then God spoke all these words, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above or that is on the earth beneath or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not acquit anyone who misuses his name. Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or

female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and consecrated it." (Word of God. Word of Life. **Thanks be to God**.)

THE SECOND LESSON: Galatians 3:23-29

Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be reckoned as righteous by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise. (Word of God. Word of Life. **Thanks be to God**.)

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: (Please stand for the Gospel.)

(The Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke, the 10th chapter. Glory to You, O Lord.) THE GOSPEL: Luke 10:25-37

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked. "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

"What is written in the Law?" He replied. "How do you read it?"

He answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself."

"You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. "Do this and you will live." But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense vou may have.'

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied. "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

(The Gospel of our Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ!**)

THE SMALL CATECHISM by Martin Luther: 10 Commandments and Meanings The First Commandment You shall have no other gods. What does this mean? We are to fear, love, and trust God above all things.

The Second Commandment You shall not take the Lord's name in vain. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not use God's name to curse, swear, lie, or deceive, but instead use that very name in every time of need to call on, pray to, praise, and give thanks to God.

The Third Commandment Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not despise preaching or the hearing of God's word, but instead keep that word holy and gladly hear and learn it.
