PRAYER OF THE DAY

THE FIRST LESSON: Exodus 20:12-16

"Honor your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."
(Word of God. Word of Life. **Thanks be to God.**)

THE SECOND LESSON: Galatians 5:1, 13-25

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become enslaved to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. By contrast,

the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

THE GOSPEL: Luke 9:51-56

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him. On their way they entered a village of the Samaritans to prepare for his arrival, but they did not receive him because his face was set toward Jerusalem. When his disciples James and John saw this, they said, "Lord, do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" But he turned and rebuked them. Then they went on to another village.

(The Gospel of our Lord. **Praise to You, O Christ!**)

SMALL CATECHISM by Martin Luther - Commandments 4-8 and Meanings
The Fourth Commandment. Honor your father and your mother, that it may be well with you, and that you may live long on the earth. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not despise our parents and others in authority, nor provoke them to anger, but honor, serve, obey, love and esteem them.

The Fifth Commandment. You shall not kill. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do no bodily harm to our neighbor, but help and befriend them in every need.

The Sixth Commandment. You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we lead a chaste and decent life in word and deed, and that husband and wife love and honor each other.

The Seventh Commandment. You shall not steal. *What does this mean?*

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not take our neighbor's money or goods, nor get them in any dishonest way, but help them to improve and protect their goods and means of making a living.

The Eighth Commandment. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not lie about, betray or slander our neighbor, but speak well of them, and explain their actions in the kindest way.
